


Narrated Abu Hurairah [radhi-yAllâhu 'anhu]: One day while the Prophet [sal-Allâhu 'alayhi wa sallam] was sitting in the company of some people, a man came and asked, "What is Faith?" Allâh's Messenger [sal-Allâhu 'alayhi wa sallam] replied, "Faith is to believe in Allâh, His angels, (the) Meeting with Him, His Messengers, and to believe in Resurrection."*

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* In this Hadîth, only 4 articles are mentioned, while in another Hadîth, <u>6 articles are mentioned</u>: (i) Allâh, (ii) His Angels,
(iii) His Books (the Torah, the Gospel, the Qur'ân and all the other Holy Books revealed by Allâh), (iv) His Messengers, (v) Day of Resurrection and (vi) Al-Qadar (Divine Preordainments), i.e. whatever Allâh has ordained, must come to pass.














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Narrated By 'Ubada: The Prophet said, "If anyone testifies that None has the right to be worshipped but Allah Alone Who has no partners, and that Muhammad (25 is His Slave and His Apostle, and that 'Isa is Allah's Slave and His Apostle and His Word which He bestowed on Maryam and a Spirit created by Him, and that Paradise is true, and Hell is true, Allah will admit him into Paradise with the deeds which he had done even if those deeds were few." (Junada, the sub-narrator said, " 'Ubada added, 'Such a person can enter Paradise through any of its EIGHT GATES he likes.") Vol 4, Book 55. Prophets.

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And indeed We gave Mûsâ (Moses) nine clear signs. [17:101]

"So these nine signs were: (1) the rod, (2) the shining hand, (3) the drought, (4) the loss of fruits, (5) the widespread death, (6) the locusts, (7) the lice, (8) the frogs, and (9) the blood." From: Lessons from the stories of The Qur'an By Ali Musa Raza Muhajir

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And certainly We overtook Fir'aun's people with droughts and diminution fruits that they may be mindful. But , when good befell them they said: This is due to us. And when evil afflicted them, they attributed it to the ill-luck of Musa and those with him. Surely their evil fortune is only from Allah but most of them do not know. And they said: whatever sign thou mayest bring to us to charm us with, we will not believe in thee. Therefore We sent upon them widespread death, and the locusts, and the lice, and the frogs, and the blood, clear signs, but they behaved haughtily and they were a guilty people. And when the plague fell upon them they said: O Musa! Pray for us to thy Lord as He has promised with thee. If thou remove the plague from us, we will certainly believe in thee and we will certainly send away with thee the children of Israel. But when We removed the plague from them till a term which they should attain, lo! they broke their promise. (7:130-135)

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Narrated Saeed bin Zayd:

Abdur-Rahman bin Al-Akhnas said that when he was in the mosque, a man abused Ali (RA). So Saeed bin Zayd got up and said, "I bear witness to the Apostle of Allah (pbuh) that I heard him say, 'Ten persons will go to Paradise. **Abu Bakr** will go to Paradise, **Umar** will go to Paradise, **Uthman** will go to Paradise, **Ali** will go to Paradise.

Zubair bin Al-Awwam will go to Paradise, **Sa'd bin Abi Waqqas** will go to Paradise, **Abdur-Rahman bin Awf** will go to Paradise and **Abu Ubaidah bin Al-Jarrah**. If I wish, I can mention the tenth."

The People asked, "Who is he?" so he kept silent. They again asked, "Who is he?"

He replied, "He is **Saeed ibn Zayd.**" He then said, "The company of one man whose face has been covered with dust by the Apostle of Allah (pbuh) is better than the actions of one of you for a whole life time even if he is granted the life-span of Noah." [Abu Dawud] (http://www.sahaba.net/)

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
